The Bauer Leadership Fellows Program is designed to help students advance their leadership capacity and refine and understand their values and strengths.

Why become a Bauer Leadership Fellow?

- Participate in leadership experiences designed to stretch you and advance your insight and capabilities
- Work with an exclusive group of top student leaders
- Gain access to faculty and leadership coaches who can help you develop
- Learn to solve immediate problems faced as a leader and develop your skills
- Earn course credit for your leadership experience
- Receive designation as a *Bauer Leadership Fellow* (with graduation medallion and certificate) to signal your leadership capabilities and engagement to the market

Program Requirements

The program follows the 70/20/10 model of leadership development by combining challenging leadership experiences (70%), developmental relationships (20%), and coursework and training (10%) to develop your leadership capacity. These requirements can be SUCCESSFULLY completed any time prior to your graduation.

- 1) Apply, be accepted and successfully complete the CEL Practicum Program as a Team Lead and, as a companion to your CEL Practicum Team Lead experience, successfully complete OB 4660 (UG) | OB 5660 (G) "Leadership in the Trenches: Learning to Lead through Experience and Feedback" (1.5 credits) Class times TBD, you will be registered by the BLC after acceptance as a CEL Practicum Team Lead.
- 2) Enroll in and successfully complete B66 OB 4720 "Defining Moments: Lessons in Leadership and Character from the Top" (1.5 credits) offered in Spring Mini A.
